

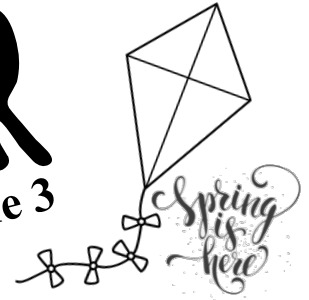

# PASTOR'S REFLECTIONS



*Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin. For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me. Against you, you alone, have I sinned, and done what is evil in your sight, so that you are justified in your sentence and blameless when you pass judgment. Indeed, I was born guilty, a sinner when my mother conceived me. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and sustain in me a willing spirit. Then I will teach transgressors your ways and sinners will return to you.*

Lent is a time of preparation. A walk with Christ to the cross. Setting aside time for prayer and meditation. A time to reflect inward - looking our sins square in the face. Seeing where we strayed from God. Changing our minds to turn back to God. We ask for forgiveness and we hear Jesus say, "Your debt is paid, go in peace and love one another as I have loved you."

In the following weeks of Lent, take time with Jesus. Read a portion of scriptures and then reflect on it. What stood out for you? What did it say to you? You can begin with a few verses of Psalm 51. Another source to use for reflection is the Lenten devotional.

Take time to reflect on the cross.

They provide “Earn While You Learn” classes which helps clients grow in knowledge from pregnancy all the way through parenting children, life skills classes, healthy relationship classes, Natural Family Planning and Fertility Awareness classes, along with a Dad program and even Bible Study classes. Clients can earn points to be exchanged for baby needs like diapers, clothing, and other baby needs. They work to meet the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of their clients. They offer a car seat program, free pregnancy and STI testing, and free limited ultrasound services. All programs available in both English and Spanish. Through your generosity, we have been able to open a satellite office in Ortonville (March, 2025) to expand our mission and ministry to even more families. THANK YOU for your generous support in the past and we ask you to prayerfully consider donating through this Baby Bottle Campaign. We lost ALL of our state funding from the MN Positive Alternatives Grant in 2023 — so we are making a special plea for donations. The grant covered about 70% of our budget and the legislators removed all funding from pro-life centers for the entire state of Minnesota. Thank you for what you are able to do.

## SCRIPTURE/SERMON SUMMARIES — MARCH 2026

### March 1 — Read Genesis 12:1-6

Abram and his wife Sarai are sent on a faith quest. They look rather foolish to the world. They leave the security of a kinship community to go out and trust an unknown God while becoming foreigners in a strange land. The faith of Abram and Sarai in this passage is not defined by doctrines or clear convictions. Faith is a walk of life where people learn who their God is through a trusted relationship. This is true in the Gospel of John as well where faith is never a noun. It is always a verb, an action that trusts in a relationship that recognizes that one's entire existence is dependent upon God. That is what faith looks like. And it has consequences for others because faith is never a private affair: *"in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed"* (Genesis 12:3b). *Discuss:* How would you describe the journey of faith that you have been on?

### March 8 - Read John 4:5-42

Jesus meets with a Samaritan woman at Jacob's well, the same place where Jacob met Rachel more than a thousand years before. It is now the place where Jesus shows what it means that *"God so loved the world"* (John 3:16) by caring for a non-Jewish woman, someone who was alone and likely shunned by her own people. The woman is so impressed by Jesus and their conversation that she goes to her townspeople and says, *"Come and see a man who told me everything I have ever done! He cannot be the Messiah, can he?"* (v. 29). The Samaritan woman does three things that are essential traits of evangelism: 1) she invites, *"Come and see"*; 2) she tells her own story of her encounter with Jesus, *"I just met a man who . . ."*; and 3) she wonders if this is the awaited Messiah, *"He cannot be the Messiah, can he?"* Her question in the original Greek suggests she really doesn't think so. Even so, the people come to believe that Jesus is the Savior. It is another biblical example that shows that faith is formed by the power of the Holy Spirit through personal, trusted relationships. *Discuss:* How do you have conversations with others about Jesus.

### March 15 - Read 1 Samuel 16:1-13 and John 9:1-41

In John 9, Jesus sees in the blind man a person who needs mercy and sight. This story is built on an important theme that Jesus is the *"true light, which enlightens everyone"* introduced in John 1:9. Just as Jesus gave sight to the blind man, Jesus gives divine light for all the world. Jesus' light challenges the Pharisees who think they see yet do not truly see. In 1 Samuel the prophet is to anoint a new king, but Samuel is not able to perceive or see what God sees. A scrawny, youngest son (David), who is originally not even considered as a candidate, is chosen by God to be king. Thankfully, God sees and decides by a standard far different from our own. In our blindness, Jesus comes to us and shows God's work of healing and new life. The light Jesus brings into the world helps us to see ourselves and others with mercy. *Discuss:* How has Jesus, the *"true light,"* enlightened your life and helped you see others with mercy?

### March 22 - Read John 11:1-45

With the story of the raising of Lazarus, Jesus makes it clear that he is not only the source of *"the resurrection on the last day"* (v. 24), but the source of life now. Jesus does not just say he is the resurrection. He says, *"I am the resurrection and the life"* (v. 25). In this story we gain understanding of what it means that Jesus is the *"Messiah, the Son of God, the one coming into the world"* (v. 27). The future hope of the resurrection is so important and so real that it changes our life in the present. Even though Jesus weeps with his friends, grief does not control his—or our—life. Our lives are to be freed from the daily powers of sin, fear, and death. *"Unbind him and let him go"* (v. 44) is the message for us, too. Jesus comes to us when our burdens are many, to unbind us and set us free. Jesus says, *"Everyone who lives and believes in me will never die"* (v. 26). *Discuss:* How does faith in Jesus impact your priorities, your values, your relationships?

### March 29 - Read Matthew 26:14–27:66

Many theories have been put forward in the history of the church to state why Jesus had to die to be our Savior. However, one point is clear in the Bible: Jesus' death shows the depth of God's love, a love that is willing to experience a form of slavery, humiliation, and excruciating death, *"even death on a cross"* (Philippians 2:8). Crosses have become forms of jewelry and part of other art forms that point to Jesus' death. However, neither jewelry nor other art forms fully express the pain and humiliation that God in Christ endured to indicate the character of who God is for us. Jesus joins our human existence by making our deepest prayer his prayer: *"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"* (Matthew 27:46). God in Christ Jesus joins our life experience and from the cross stretches out his arms to say, *"I love you this much."* *Discuss:* When you see someone wearing a cross, what does it mean to you?
